[Bhamwiki.com](http://Bhamwiki.com) recently celebrated its first anniversary in March. Created by John Morse as part of [The Project to Document the Birmingham Distirct](#), the site currently contains some 2,320 articles about Birmingham, Alabama and the surrounding region. The project also includes the [Magic City Flickr Group](#), a group of photographers that have taken on the task of documenting the city one image at a time. The Flickr Group currently has more than 240 members submitting their photos to the online photo service. **The Terminal** currently uses Bhamwiki as a resource for link information about people and places in the region. We are also finalizing a column that will provide visitors to The Terminal with a slice of Birmingham history every day.
