

Birmingham native and former [UAB](#) starting quarterback [Joe Webb](#) ran 13 yards for the [Minnesota Vikings](#) to record [his first career NFL touchdown](#) during Monday night's 40-17 loss to the Chicago Bears at [TCF Bank Stadium](#) in Minneapolis, MN.

The [Wenonah High School](#) graduate was originally scheduled to start last night for the Vikings but future NFL Hall of Famer [Brett Favre](#) had other plans, starting for the 298th time in his career instead after his consecutive starts streak ended last week.

A sack knocked Favre out of the game in the 2nd quarter with a head injury, leading to Webb taking over behind center. He finished the game completing 15 of his 26 pass attempts, good for 129 yards. He had one fumble, two interceptions and three sacks to go along with that touchdown.
