Encilor Rafferty's proposal to reduce the number of representatives from the City of Birmingham serving on the <u>BJCTA</u>'s Transit Advisory Committee (held over for three weeks already) is back on <u>the council agenda</u> today (**Item 6**). There's also a \$22,000 bid to re-carpet <u>Legion Field</u>'s skybox (**Item 20**).

The major item on today's agenda involves the city's storm water management program. **Item 14** allows the mayor to enter a contract with <u>Malcolm Pirnie</u> for up to \$535,975 to assist with the development of that plan and to help prepare a required report to <u>ADEM</u>. **Item 15** puts them under contract (for \$89,895) to help address issues brought up during a recent audit of the city's storm water management system.
