The festival kicks off Friday, Sept. 28, with a screening of "The Ten," a comedy loosely based on the Ten Commandments starring a bunch of big names including Winona Ryder, Adam Brody, Jessica Alba. Cost: Opening night tickets are \$10 in advance/\$13 at the door. Weekend passes (Saturday and Sunday) are \$25 in advance/\$30 at the door. Sidewalk members and students with valid ID enjoy ticket discounts. Single film tickets (Saturday and Sunday) are \$7 each or \$17 for a 3-pack.
